Help Needed To Slow Traffic

On Wednesday 14th June, a number of residents of Daws House attended the Parish Council meeting to address the issue of dangerous driving at excessive speeds through the hamlet. In total, over twenty households were either present, or had sent their support and apologies for being unable to attend.

Due to many drivers passing through Daws House at speeds far in excess of the 30 mph limit, and a number of near misses when residents are leaving their driveways, or walking along the B3254, it was felt that attention should be drawn to this ever-worsening issue. A number of young families now live here and children have narrowly avoided being struck by cars when walking to catch the school bus, or walking home at the end of the school day. These children must walk on the road, owing to the fact that no footpath is available. Older residents too, have had many close calls when out walking. Residents are being shown aggression on a more regular basis, even when slowing down to turn onto their drive.

The Parish Council adopted a pro-active stance, suggesting that we have a better chance of getting something done if South Petherwin is included too, the greater number of people living here adding weight to the issue of traffic travelling through both areas with increasing speed and in complete defiance of the speed limit.

On behalf of all the people who live along the B3254, or who have to join it on a regular basis, I would ask that as many people as possible sign our petition. The Parish Council needs this support to take the matter further and present a proper case to the higher authorities that make decisions about such things. Paper petitions will be available to sign at the school reception and will circulate around the village.

What Next for the Church?

Rev Heather West talks to Helena Northmore about the impact of the shop closure and plans for the future.

What are your thoughts about the shop closure? Like most people I'm very disappointed. But the shop wasn't making enough to survive so there was no real alternative. Everyone connected with the shop worked really hard to keep it open but struggled against lack of support. It's very sad it didn't work.



What is happening to the shop fixtures and fittings and any remaining monies?

Any food items left over were donated to Launceston food bank. The till was returned to the dioceses who will use it for another project. All the Post Office equipment had to be returned to the Post office of course. Items like the fridge and the A-frames are being kept and used in the church. Some of the original funding from the diocese was earmarked to build a disabled ramp in the church to make access easier, and this is now being built. Any remaining monies from the original dioceses fund will be returned to Truro

How does the shop closure affect the church?

Well, one of the great advantages of the shop was having people coming into the church on a daily basis and seeing the church 'being used differently' (This was one of the main objectives of the dioceses granting the funding in the first place) But although the shop has closed we're planning to keep the church open every day, as soon as the disabled ramp has been built. At the moment the building work makes it too risky to leave the church open but hopefully it will be finished by the end of the summer. In the meantime services will continue as normal and we will still be selling second hand books

Any new plans concerning the church?

We are now holding coffee mornings on the first Saturday of every month (next one is Saturday 5th August) and hope to develop them in the future by selling some fairtrade goods and maybe having an occasional speaker in. I'm also hoping we will start to have some more informal services in the church and a special service to rededicate the clock. It's important for the church to move forward and look to the future





Methodist Chapel News

The chapel was beautifully decorated for our Chapel Anniversary held on 14th May. The special preacher for our afternoon service was Rev Chris Tomlinson. He gave us much to ponder over including how much our services have changed down through the years. The organist was Mr Gordon Maunder. The service was followed by a scrumptious afternoon tea served in the Sunday School room, where over 30 family and friends were able to sit down and enjoy fellowship together. Our recent coffee mornings have continued to support our new chosen charity the Barnabas Aid Fund (Hope & Relief for the Persecuted Church)

As many of you will have observed by now, the scaffolding has been erected around the chapel building. The Grade 2 listed chapel was built some 145 years ago and has been subjected to all weathers which together with its age has taken its toll on the building. In 1991 the Methodist Property Quinquennial Inspection report identified that the roof would need replacing within the next 15 years. The last Quinquennial report in November 2016 considered this work now essential and urgent and following this ongoing advice the Major building work to re slate and insulate the roof is now in progress.

No activities will be taking place within the building as the whole churchyard is closed and out of bounds to the general public for obvious safety reasons and for the duration. Our Sunday morning services will continue though, but with restricted access only on the designated pathway leading to the main chapel door.

The Church Clock Update

Yes, at last! Up and running, ticking, chiming and with the two clock faces repaired, repainted and the 'hands' regilded with gold leaf and paint. It was an undertaking not without tension and drama, but the end result is one that should bring both credit and confidence to the village. Whether you are walking or driving through South Petherwin the eye is drawn to the clock, black and gold – true Cornish colours indeed. In addition, the complete clock mechanisms that date back to 1911, have received the equivalent of a MOT, and the clockmaker's technician - stated that he could see no reason why 'the works couldn't be good enough for another century'. Heartening words indeed.

Although the clock still has to be wound by hand-roughly three times a week – by the 'band of stalwart winders', the whole 'machine' is a real credit to British crafts-manship and technical skill dating back to the 19th Century. So, a really big thank you to everybody who has helped in so many diverse ways to bring this project to such a pleasing and positive conclusion. It is hoped that this improvement will be of lasting benefit to all who live in, pass through, or visit the village for both current and future generations.

Alert from Action Fraud

A number of tourists have been targeted by fake police officers according to Devon & Cornwall Alert. The free to use two- way messaging service is operated by Devon & Cornwall Police. They recently sent out an alert from



Action Fraud (National Fraud Intelligence Bureau) which said that a lone fraudster had approached victims whom they believe to be unfamiliar with the area. The police will never ask for passwords or PIN details, request a person to withdraw money to transfer to them or to a 'safe' account. It is good practice to ask for their name and rank, force and any ID, especially if they are not wearing a uniform. If anyone has been affected by this or any other fraud please report it to Action Fraud. Tel – 0300 123 2040 or www.actionfraud.police.uk.

The messaging service is a much improved site now where there is an option to select which of the services you wish to receive messages from. Launceston Show

The Launceston show was founded following a meeting held at the White Hart Hotel on Saturday 19th February 1887, when it was resolved to hold a horse show for the district. A committee was duly elected and it was agreed to make the sum of £130 available for prize money.



Thursday 21st August 1887 was fixed as the date of the first Launceston show. In the early years the show was held within the town boundary of Launceston at both Windmill and Hurdon, until moving to the current site at Kennards House in the mid 1950's, Launceston Horse Show as it was known in the early days was highly respected as an equestrian event, and before the popularity of the motor car, large crowds gathered each year with the railways running special 'show trains' from places such as

Plymouth for the event.



This year's show will be held on Thursday 27th July in the ususal Kennards House site. More information can be found at launcestonshow.co.uk

Gardening Matters

Over the last month or so we have experienced a mix of wind, rain and tropical sun. At this time of year the garden is looking at its best, so it's time to relax a little and enjoy your efforts. There will always be little jobs of which here are a few.

Watering and feeding – in early morning or evening on hot days and prioritise plants that have been newly planted, are in containers, bedding plants and veg/salad crops. Established shrubs, trees and perennials should have roots deep enough not to need continual watering.

Regular harvest and make successive sowings of salad crops – such as lettuce, radish, rocket and watercress to give you a regular longer lasting supply.

Lightly prune roses to remove spent flower buds and encourage repeat flowers, also feed with rose fertiliser.

If in these bouts of hot weather you are getting fed up of all this watering here are some more drought tolerant sun loving plants to consider:

Pelagoniums, Begonias, Gazanias, Poppies, Sedums, Grasses, Dianthus pinks, Lavenders and many of the daisy family.

Looking especially good now are Roses and Agapanthus

The authors favourite word is "anodyne", and she feels she must mention it at least once in every chapter.
