Despite Storm Eleanor, on a very wet and windy January night, South Petherwin Slimming World opened its doors for the very first time at the Methodist Chapel Hall, welcoming 29 new members from the village and surrounding areas.

Three years ago, Val who runs the group weighed nearly 17 stone. Her turning point was listening to a doctor talking about a

clinically obese patient with a suspected heart attack, and then the realisation he was talking about her. Joining slimming world completely changed her life and her relationship with food. She successfully lost just over 5 stone without ever being hungry, counting calories, or feeling guilty about eating the things she enjoyed most.

Feeling she has been given a second chance, Val wanted to help others to lose weight so decided to take a step into the unknown, became self employed, and trained to become a slimming world consultant.

Deciding where to hold the group was easy. Val lives at Lower Larrick and wanted somewhere close to home, out of town, which has plenty of parking. It had to be South Petherwin.

After speaking to the lovely Wendy Smith and Rev Jo Smart at The Methodist Chapel she knew she had made the right decision and would like to take this opportunity to thank them for their support.

From her own experience she knows that healthy eating, simply making the right choices combined with healthy living, and becoming a bit more active can have remarkable results.

Get Greener this year; recycle more, throw away less but most of all....

Use Less Plastic!

The environmental consequences of plastic use are massive, but there are some things we can all do about it, and it is in the news a lot at the moment. The production and distribution of plastic has a huge carbon footprint, and many plastic products are designed to be disposable, and are destined for the landfill after just one use. Recycling is not the perfect solution either as plastic is never able to be truly recycled and converted back into what it was. At best it can be down-cycled into another product, such as textiles, and at worst it ends up in landfill, or littering the country-side, waterways, and oceans. It takes 450 - 1,000 years for plastic to degrade.

An estimated 12.7 million tonnes of plastic end up in our oceans each year. Nearly half of all plastics float and it can drift for years on the ocean currents before eventually turning up on beaches, remote islands or trapped in Arctic ice. Furthermore, it is estimated that 100,000 marine mammals and a million seabirds die every year through entanglement in and ingestion of marine litter.

If you love Cornish beaches, there are plenty of initiatives for joining in with beach cleaning, either on special organised days (eg. The Great British Beach Clean or Surfers Against Sewage) or by collecting and disposing of a few items of rubbish every time you enjoy your local beach, such as Widemouth Bay. There is also a new campaign titled 'The Final Straw Cornwall' which is aiming to prevent further plastic pollution by becoming the first county to ban plastic straws in order to protect its beaches (an estimated 8.5 billion straws are used in the UK every year).

- •Apart from recycling the plastic that you do use at home, check out the Less Plastic website (www.lessplastic.co.uk) for some great tips to reducing your own plastic consumption including:
 - Use your own shopping bags
 - -Carry a reusable water bottle
 - Pack your lunch in reusable containers
 - -Say no to disposable straws and cutlery
 - -Skip the plastic produce bags in the supermarket

- Use bamboo toothbrushes instead of plastic ones
- Use soap instead of handwash and shower gels in plastic containers
- Take your own cup to the coffee store. Currently Costa, for example, knock 25p off your drink if you bring your own cup. (The government are now thinking about a 'Latte Levy' on disposable cups that would ADD 25p onto your coffee! There are also calls for a complete ban on all disposable cups by 2023 unless manufacturers can make them recyclable.)

Last November, Graham Davey, who lives in a cottage in the middle of the village, noticed a man walking up and down the road outside his house. In all honesty Graham thought he looked a bit suspicious. He carried on with his building work in the house, and the next thing he knew



the man was standing behind him in his doorway. It was obvious the stranger didn't speak English. He looked at Grahams tools, picked up a plastering trowel and indicated he would be happy to plaster the wall. Graham says it was obvious he knew what he was doing, so was happy to let him.

Over the next hour they communicated through sign language, pidgin English and some opera Italian Graham had learnt from singing lessons. He discovered the man was from Romania where he had a wife and two daughters, and was currently working in an abattoir or butchers. His name was Gogu and he was 62. He made a good



job of plastering the wall but made it clear he didn't want any payment. They had a cup of tea together, 'talked' some more and the man left with Graham saying he was welcome to come back anytime. A few days later he knocked on Graham's door and stayed just long enough to tell him his job was 'kaput' and 'no more'.

Graham hasn't seen him since and has no idea what he was doing in the village. But he says he's sorry he has gone, as they got on well, and both seemed surprised at how much they could communicate with no language in common.






CHURCH NEWS


