

Sticky Chicken Great for the BBQ or oven



Ingredients:

- 2 tbsp tomato puree
- 6 tbsp tomato ketchup
- 2 tbsp grainy mustard
- 3 tbsp Worcestershire
- 3 tosp worcester
- 2 tbsp runny honey
- 1 clove garlic
- 6 chicken legs or thighs

Method:

- 1. Make shallow slits in the tops of the chicken.
- 2. Mix together all the other ingredients in a bowl.
- 3. Add the chicken & toss it in the sauce until coated.
- 4. Cover and put in the fridge for at least 30 minutes.
- 5. Put into a pre-heated oven 220c/200 Fan/ Gas 7 on a baking paper lined roasting tin. Cover in the sauce and roast for 35/40 mins or until sticky, golden brown and cooked through.

Douglas and Sylvia Jane recently celebrated sixty four years of marriage. For almost all their married life they have lived in South Petherwin. They are both lifelong chapel attenders and on 26th March 1955 they married at Downhouse Chapel near Stoke Climsland both having lived in that area for most of their childhood, although Sylvia was born in Tresparret.

Parish Council Update By Rebecca Frame, Parish Clerk



Cornwall Council is undertaking a Community Governance Review for the whole of Cornwall. It provides an opportunity for local councils, communities and individuals to review and propose changes at parish level such as parish boundaries, and the number of seats and warding arrangements for local councils. Any proposals must be reflective of the identity and interest of the community and support effective and convenient community governance. It has been proposed, by Launceston Town Council, that the Launceston town

boundary should extend to include Pennygillam Industrial Estate and the three residents to the north of the industrial estate. The estate and the properties are currently within South Petherwin Parish.

Further boundary changes proposed by Launceston Town Council affect Tregadillett parish therefore a consultation with Parishioners will be held on 1st June 2019 between 1000 am and 1200 pm in Tregadillett Village Hall. South Petherwin Parish Council are very keen to hear your views on the proposed boundary changes and also the views of residents living in Tregadillett but who are in the parish of South Petherwin.

PA18/12017 for a proposed agri-business centre, employment land and trunk road service area is now a pre-planning application under PA19/00821/PREAPP. The Parish Council will continue to monitor progress of this planning application and keep parishioners updated.

Painting and repair of the telephone box will be carried out in May and three organisations have volunteered to decorate the box on a three month each trial basis. This will begin in June.

The Parish Meeting will be held on 29th May 2019 in the Village Hall. Hopefully all village organisations have received an agenda and an invite. If I have missed you from the list please let me know. Guest speakers will be PC Steve Stoppard to talk to us about 'being safe online' and Joan Heaton, Chair of Launceston Patient Participation Group, to update us on the Launceston Medical Centre expansion. All are very welcome to attend.

GARDENING MATTERS

Wonderful Easter weather has helped bring on early growth and blossom. Cherry and Apple trees are looking stunning. The weather is still very changeable though so don't be tempted to put bedding plants and seedlings out too early. It is advisable to wait til mid to late May.

Jobs in May & June

- Newly planted trees and shrubs need regular watering to help the roots establish.
- Plant out Dahlias and Cannas towards the end of May.
- Sow Foxgloves, Wall Flowers and Sweet Williams now for flowering next spring.
- Continue sowings of vegetables and salad crops.
- Keep checking plants regularly for damage caused by pests and diseases.
- Prepared hanging baskets and containers can be hardened off by placing them outside for increasing amounts of time and then place in their final position to admire throughout the summer.
- Heathers can be trimmed lightly back to neat clumps to remove spent flowers.
- Overgrown pond plants can be split and divided and remove duckweed and blanket weed from the surface.
- As perennials grow, ensure they have adequate supports and tie in the growing shoots of Clematis and other summer climbers.

London Marathon



Andy Berry of Tregaller House recently completed the 2019 London Marathon in a time of 4hrs 54 mins. Having only completed around half of his training plan (8 weeks worth) due to various injuries (mainly knees), Andy went up to London in good spirits and "rock-taped up" and was well supported by his son Jimmy and best mate, also another Jimmy. [Andy's wife, Fiona and daughter, Jess were at Bristol the same day where the Launceston U12 girls hockey team played at the regional finals and came away a very credible fourth in their pool with some great play against much larger clubs.]

The marathon race was going to plan for Andy until just after the 1 mile mark the right knee pain increased in intensity and the rock tape and paracetamol weren't really doing their job. However seeing the massive crowd and both Jim's three or four times around

the course lifted his spirits and getting to meet the disabled children at mile 9 and mile 20 really spurred Andy on.

For most of the 26.2 miles race, (actually nearer to 27 miles as you have to zig-zag a lot to avoid runners who suddenly stop), Andy was snacking on jelly beans and flapjack after having a big carb-loading breakfast at 6.30am. He had a slight malfunction at the start of the race where he lost a bag of beans, which spilt out of his pocket causing a few comments from other race goers trying not to slip on them! Andy's real fear was "hitting the Wall" (where you basically burn up all of your calories around mile 19/20 and you don't have any energy left for your muscles to work). "There were a few people collapsing around mile 20 in front of me which made me nervous and I really didn't want to meet it, so I just keep eating and drinking and kept the running pace pretty much the same throughout the race."

The last few miles were just awesome and Andy slowed down a little to absorb the crowd and to take in the famous landmarks. "If anyone is thinking of running a marathon, do it, especially London." Andy has three tips: wear your name on your shirt/vest, as the crowd literally revitalised you every time your name was shouted out; don't drink water at every water station on the route, (you will spend a lot of running time actually queuing for the toilet around the course); and wear an old jumper on top of your running vest as you are kept in your start zone for around 45 minutes and on Sunday it was very chilly around 09.30. All the discarded jumpers are given to charities and the homeless.

Cake & Rakers



May the 4th is apparently International Star Wars Day (May the 4th be with you!) but it was also the date of our first rake of the churchyard this year. You may have noticed that only part of the churchyard has been cut. This is the section we are managing as a summer meadow, so cutting it now should allow

later flowering plants to have a chance to come through. Raking the cuttings is important as it reduces the fertility of the soil and so favours species of wild flower and grasses that are outcompeted by more virulent species that thrive on nutrient-rich soils. It also reduces thatching and improves the overall appearance of the cut areas.

We had a very healthy number of volunteers and had finished raking as well as consuming assorted beverages and apple cake by lunchtime. We also had our first volunteer prize draw – congratulations to the winner Charlotte Lancaster! We have also installed two small panels explaining

that the churchyard is being managed for wildlife in partnership with Living Churchyards and Cornwall Wildlife Trust.

The other section of the churchyard has been left to allow the spring flowering plants to finish, and will be cut before the hogweed has a chance to spread. It is gratifying to see that our efforts from last year have



already made a difference – last year there were only a handful of individual *Cardamine pratensis* (Cuckooflower, Lady's smock or Milkmaids depending on your provenance!), important as a food source for the Orange-tip butterfly. This year while not quite yet abundant, there is a very healthy population over a wider area, which is a good indicator of conditions improving.

We have more work to do including the provision of access to visited graves, but are optimistic that we have a sustainable way forward working with Cormac. The next rake will be in June when the spring meadow will be cut – watch out for dates and times through our Facebook page (South Petherwin Cake and Rakers) or email spcakeandrakers@gmail.com for more information.

FARMING NEWS



As spring slips away and summer looms most of the spring cereals and cropping are planted beneath a warming soil. We hear a great deal in the press about the health of the soil but for most farmers it's common sense to look after your main producer. Lime is nearly always one key component which both enables healthy crops while balancing the goodness in the soil. You will see a bloom of white dust cover the field as the spreader deposits the required amount of lime. Soil is tested prior to crops being planted and the pH level of 6.5 is seen as a healthy

productive level. If it starts to drop below 5.5 pH then yields reduce and crops struggle to grow vigorously. Too high a level can also lead to the soil being unproductive as it locks the goodness up. As summer approaches farmers will be hoping they have the right balance of productive soils and look forward to another fruitful year. For some that means they will have taken their first cut of silage in 2019. Just how many more cuts to come will be entirely dependent on that British obsession, the weather.... Phil Parsons

The flag pole that sits proudly on top of the tower of St Paternus Church in South Petherwin displays a variety of flags throughout the year, but do you know on what occasions the various flags appear?

In general, there are three flags than can be seen fluttering from time to time:

The Union Flag

The St George's Cross flag

The flag of St Piran

Starting with the obvious ones, the flag of St Piran is flown on March 5th (St Pirans Day), and the St George's Cross flag is flown on April 23rd (St Georges Day). The Union flag can be flown on the following occasions:

Birthday of The Duchess of Cambridge 09 January 20 January Birthday of The Countess of Wessex

Her Majesty's Accession 06 February 19 February Birthday of The Duke of York 10 March Birthday of The Earl of Wessex

21 April Birthday of The Her Majesty The Queen

Europe Day 09 May Coronation Day 02 June

Birthday of The Duke of Edinburgh 10 June 21 June Birthday of The Duke of Cambridge 17 July Birthday of The Duchess of Cornwall Birthday of The Princess Royal 15 August Birthday of The Prince of Wales 14 November 20 November Her Majesty's Wedding Day

NON-FIXED DAYS

March (2nd Monday) - Commonwealth Day

June (1st, 2nd or 3rd Saturday) - Official Celebration of Her Majesty's Birthday November (2nd Sunday) - Remembrance Day

Of course, the flying of any flag from the Church tower relies on the good will and endeavour of Sue Vernon, who has to clamber up the tower steps

in order to attach the flag to the pole.

Finally, there is a "right way up" to fly the Union Flag - in the half of the flag nearest the flagpole, the wider diagonal white stripe must be above the red diagonal stripe, as Scotland's St Andrew's Cross takes precedence over Ireland's St. Patrick's Cross (left).

U3A Local History Group wins prestigious Heritage Award 2019

At a recent ceremony, Cornwall Museums Partnership and the SW Museum Development gave "Heritage Awards" to those working to preserve Cornwall's heritage and present it in a novel manner. 2019 is only the second year that these awards have been

made with the aims of showing best practice and sharing the diverse ideas put forward by the entrants.

In 2019, there were a number of different categories of award, and members of the U3A Local History Group were nominated by Lawrence House Museum for a 'Heroes for Heritage Award' in which a volunteer team has achieved something particularly special, for the exhibition on 'Houses within Launceston Town Wall' which was mounted in the Museum in 2017 and 2018.



To their amazement, the team was shortlisted, so two

members - Diana Sutherland and Tessa Baker (pictured) - attended the ceremony on 21st March. To the team's delight, and that of their nominator Lawrence House Museum, they won their category. The award will be on display in Lawrence House in the new season and is a celebration the work of all the volunteers who dedicated three years of hard work to produce an exhibition enjoyed by both the local population and visitors to the museum. This is a real achievement both for Launceston U3A and for Lawrence House Museum and special congratulations are due to all who made the award possible.

North Hill Church Closes

The final service at St Torney's church in North Hill was held on Sunday 17th March. At the end of the service, the parishioners filed out of the church and Reverend Heather West (pictured right in the church) closed and locked the solid oak door. And then there was silence. Six hundred years of worship in North Hill had come to an end.

The Venerable Audrey Elkington, Archdeacon of Bodmin, assisted by Reverend Heather West and Dr Brian Davis, led the closing service. It was attended by over 80 people from the village and surrounding churches and chapels. While acknowledging the great sadness of the occasion, the Archdeacon encouraged the congregation to consider how the focus of the church, the Christian religion, continues. Nevertheless it was a sad day for many people, especially those who regularly attended services at the



church, knowing they were to be the last of many generations who had worshipped there.

And what of our church in South Petherwin? Could it be the next to close? With only a handful of regular worshippers, and rapidly dwindling funds, the future is uncertain. Like all churches, our church receives no financial assistance from the dioceses and therefore is reliant on local fund-raising events to keep it going. The rising cost of insurance, heating, repairs and maintenance mean the existing finances are quickly diminishing.



Many people in South Petherwin have a great attachment to the church, but the warning signs are there: that unless we take action, our church like St Torney's, could close within the foreseeable future. So please support our fund-raising events, help manage the churchyard along with the Cake and Rakers, or try your hand at bell ringing. Or perhaps best of all come along to one of our Sunday services in the church and find out why so many people have chosen to worship there for hundreds of years. The church is open every day from approximately 9.30am to late afternoon and is a wonderful place to experience some tranquillity and peace in our busy lives.


