# VILLAGE CALENDAR


The Parish Magazine Committee intend to produce a parish calendar

# AUTUMN IN SOUTH PETHERWIN PARISH



### Parish Council Update By Rebecca Frame, Parish Clerk



There are two items of Parish Council business to mention in this edition of the magazine.

Firstly, PA019/6264 proposed agri-business centre at Kennards House. Peter Stockall from the agent Avison Young arranged a public exhibition in the Village Hall on Monday 7<sup>th</sup> October. Over the three hours of exhibition 47 people attended and 21 people completed feedback forms. Positive comments on the feedback forms related to the hotel design, layout of the site and overall design, local

employment and agricultural employment provision, hotel and service station provision, access to the site and the mixed-use nature of the site. Other comments included: priority should be given to local-residents for employment, the Cricket Club needs more support, a negative response to the service station roof design, concerns relating to highway safety, concerns relating to traffic generation, requests for road widening and a request for a park and ride scheme. The key points of concern, however, related to the relocation of the cricket pitch and the road width near to the site.

At the Parish Council meeting held on 9<sup>th</sup> October the Parish Council agreed to support the application based on the evidence gained at the public exhibition but with the following provisions:

The application should meet cycle and pedestrian safety considerations including standard widths of pedestrian and cycleways, bus routes and/or park and ride with bus shelters, from Tregaller Lane to the flyover. Provision of an emergency vehicle exit onto Tregaller Lane. Investigation of an HGV overnight parking facility. There should be adequate security on the whole site from the outset to support the police recommendations. It must be ensured that there is adequate drainage on the site. Protection of green areas. The parish council also requested:

A Section 106 material considerations for protection and relocation of South Petherwin Cricket Club including the right to service/utilities with no impediment. To ensure a replacement cricket club pavilion forms part of the planning application. The Parish Council also recommend that the financial burden of the move should not be met by the cricket club in any way with a minimum 99-year lease.

It was agreed by all that the development would be a huge benefit for employment and agriculture in this area. It would also be a benefit to the Plusha junction in relation to traffic safety; vehicles would leave at the earlier services rather than using facilities at this dangerous junction.

# Microwave fudge Ideal for Christmas presents!

#### Ingredients:

400g golden caster sugar 397g can condensed milk 140g salted butter, chopped into pieces

1 tsp vanilla bean paste
 \* optional 2tbsp coffee liqueur
(or another alcohol of your choice amaretto or brandy work well)

#### Instructions:

Grease and line a 20cm square baking tin

with baking parchment. Put the sugar, condensed milk and butter in a large heatproof bowl (the mixture will bubble up as it cooks to roughly double its size), add a good pinch of salt and stir together.

Heat the mixture in the microwave on High for 10 mins, beating every 2-3 mins. Keep an eye on the mixture, as it will bubble up and may go over the sides of the bowl. Add the vanilla and liqueur, if using to the mixture, whisk together and heat on High for another 2-4 mins. The mixture should be caramel-coloured and thickened. Scrape into the tin and set aside for 45 mins to 1 hr until cool and firm before cutting. Pack into a box and eat within 3 weeks.

### Parish Council Update By Rebecca Frame, Parish Clerk

The second of item of Parish Council business was phase 2 of the Community Governance Review. The review panel held a meeting in Tregadillett Community Centre on 27<sup>th</sup> September. South Petherwin Parish Council Chairman attended and presented South Petherwin parish submissions. The panel only had one request and that was regarding Pennygillam Industrial Estate. South Petherwin have requested that the boundaries in Pennygillam Industrial Estate remain the same (approximately half of the Estate lies within the parish) to retain the historical boundary and allow the parish to continue with the support they provide to business owners. Launceston Town Council have requested all the Estate should be within Launceston Town to 'round off the boundary'. The Community Governance Review panel suggested that South Petherwin Parish Council and Launceston Town Council should meet to discuss a way ahead. This meeting was held in the Town Hall on Monday 7<sup>th</sup> October however no compromise was found and the submissions from the parish and the town council remain unchanged. We wait for further guidance from the Community Governance Review panel.

# GARDENING MATTERS

Apart from a few days during half term there has been no let-up in this extremely wet weather, impacting on so many gardening jobs to be done before the cold weather arrives.

### Jobs in November

- Remove leaves from lawns, ponds and paths.
- Whilst leaves break down and provide a mulch on the borders, make sure layers of wet leaves don't remain on the central crown of plants, as this can cause rotting and disease to develop.
- Make sure containers aren't constantly sitting in water. Lift pots off the ground with pot feet or bricks.
- Continue cutting back perennials as and when necessary.
- Weed and mulch borders.
- Plant tulips either in pots or at least 20cm deep in the ground.
- Garlic bulbs from the garden centre can be planted out now in the vegetable bed. They will grow on through the first half of next year and should be ready to harvest in June.
- Trim back tall roses, buddleia and other top-heavy shrubs to prevent damage from heavy rain and wind.
- For colour indoors during winter, plant prepared hyacinth bulbs and paperwhite daffodils now.
- Look out for berries on holly and other evergreens now before the birds get them all. Foliage for Christmas wreaths and decorations will keep for a surprisingly long time if picked now and kept in water in a cold garage or shed.

### LAUNCESTON STREET PASTORS

Every Saturday night from 10pm till about 1am this threesome in blue – one with a blue rucksack - walk slowly and steadily around the central part of Launceston from the multi-storey car park to the Pannier Market and from the Parade Ground to the bottom of Race Hill. Who are they and what are they about? Some will tell you they're the Street Pasties, others the folk who give out lollies, others that they are there in case anyone gets into difficulties – all partly true.

Street Pastors are a national (and international) organisation of volunteers set up by the church under the leadership of Rev Les Isaacs in south London, to show the community that we listen, help and care. Listen to anyone who wants to talk – about victories (or defeats) in a sport, bereavement, job loss, anxiety about family or friends, the meaning of life – or whatever. Help those who've drunk too much, lost a friend in town, have a sudden health issue (until first responders or the ambulance arrives), or girls who are struggling on their stiletto heels. Care by handing out a bottle of water, helping with basic First Aid, giving out flip flops – regulation blue, of course!- persuading folk to be peaceable with each other and sweeping up and binning broken bottles or glass. All the equipment (including the brush and pan) is in that rucksack. We're all members of one of the churches and value our back-up team who pray for us – and provide tea/coffee and toast during our break. We also value the CCTV team who are able to keep an eye on us most of the time and who alert us to any emergencies that may have cropped up while we are elsewhere.

So if you're out and about and see us one Saturday (or New Years Eve), please make

yourselves known to us – and don't cause us too much trouble!!

# Launceston and North Cornwall Motor Club Centenary Celebrations

2020 sees the centenary of Launceston and North Cornwall Motor Club. Founded in 1920 as "The Dunheved Motor Club" it is one of the earliest motor clubs to be formed in the South West and the first in Cornwall. The club was formed by an enthusiastic bunch of motor cyclists who lived in Launceston and the surrounding countryside. The first Secretary was Maurice Prout, the then Editor of the Cornish & Devon Post. Many social events were organised in the early days including a popular Thursday afternoon run to Crackington and back. For a real test of stamina there was the occasional run to Lands End and back. On the competitive side, rallies, sprints and hill climbs were the fashion and the latter usually involved timed runs over a half mile length on a public road.



The club is planning several special events to mark this special year including a large exhibition in Lawrence House Museum during August, September and October 2020. To help make the exhibition really special, the club would like to hear from anyone who has personal or family memories, photographs, programmes, results, awards, certificates etc related to the club from the past 100 years which they might be willing to lend.


