ver heard of the Petherwin Carol? Former local lad Eric Lane contacted the Parish magazine with this question. None of us had ever heard of it, but according to Eric this was a traditional carol sung back in the late 1950's and 60's. A number of parishioners, especially members from the local churches toured the Parish before Christmas singing carols. Money raised went to the British Empire Cancer Campaign, known today as Cancer Research UK.

ack Aunger, Mr and Mrs Claude Davey, Erma Causey, the Heard sisters and the Maddever twins were but a few of the old local families taking part. They travelled all around the Parish, when hardly anybody had a car and there were few street lights: to Little Comfort, Blackapitts, Trevozah Barton, Larrick, Hornicott, Strand, Dawes House, Tregaller, Trebursye, Tregadillett and Tregudick. During the late fifties and early sixties foot and mouth disease restricted the practice of touring around to farms and slowly the Petherwin Carol was forgotten.

oday only a few locals remember this carol but Mike Aunger with help from his mum found the original words and music set to the Old Testament book Isaiah Ch 52 v 7-9 foretelling Christs' arrival. Who would like to help revive the carol? We are planning to gather around Petherwin village pump to sing the Petherwin Carol with Eric Lane leading us, along with the other traditional



### Heavenly Weekend!

Not just to go, but to perform there in a charity concert in aid of the R.N.L.I., Cornwall Hospice Care and BBC Radio Cornwall Appeal. The



concert was called KERNOWYON A GAN [Men of Cornwall sing]. Two Years! It seemed like a long time, but with monthly Sunday rehearsals to learn new songs and new arrangements of songs the time flew by.

I made my way back to the changing rooms and with all the others, changed and prepared for the concert. Then the compère, The Right Reverend Tim Thornton, stepped forward and introduced the first of four musical directors and from that moment on I was transported. Singing with any choir is great but 600 voices compared to our normal 50, well, the sheer force of the sound is stunning!!! From the power of 'Let there be Light' and 'Nessun Dorma to the subtlety of 'Hallelujah' and 'the White Rose' which was sung in Cornish, I could have sung all night. Then came the final flourish with 'Morte Christi' and the audience joining us for 'Trelawney' & nearly raising the roof!! The evening went like a dream but was over all too soon.

The next day could have been an anti climax but it had been arranged that we & two other homeward bound choirs would sing in Basingstoke with the Basingstoke Ladies Choir. Would we have any energy left to perform? You bet your life we did!! There were only about 100 of us this time but the power and the glory was still thrumming through our veins & voices. Would I do it again, would we do it again – you bet!! Just find the venue and I for one will be there like a shot.

## A Brave Swim for Charity!

#### Dear All,

As I think most of you will know by now, I did it! However, it didn't all go according to plan. Malcolm and I went up to Gosport on Friday 16th August as planned, but the weather forecast wasn't looking good. We'd hoped that, if we couldn't swim on the Saturday, then the weather would improve on the Sunday, but it didn't.

Six of my team of 12 managed to do the swim on the Monday – glorious sunshine and a calm crossing. The rest of us returned to Gosport on Saturday

August 31st on a bright, sunny day. Hovercraft are even noisier in the water than out, and the car ferries don't half look big from water level – especially when one looks as though it is only 20 yards away, and coming straight at you! I heard the captain of one of the car ferries give a series of quick blasts on his hooter/fog horn, and heard afterwards that the passengers on the top deck were waiving and cheering us on.

One hour 52 minutes, and 2.67 miles after leaving Gillkicker Point I struggled onto the beach at Ryde – and struggled was the operative word because Ryde Sands are totally flat, so we had to wade the last 100 or so yards, and it felt as though I was walking through treacle! Once we'd congratulated each other, and had our photos taken, we had to wade back out again to the safety boats to return to Gosport – I don't mind admitting I cheated and had a ride in a kayak! So far I've raised £2225 for Aspire. I haven't got the final total of what the 24 Solent swimmers




raised, but I've been told it's going to be in the region of £33,000.

Both holidays Malcolm and I had planned this year had to be changed at the last minute—Malcolm had a job interview, and then he got pancreatitis (usually it's me that causes plans to be changed).

Things we want to do may not always go according to plan, but one event did – the birth of Jesus. God planned it very carefully, and His Son was born into a human family, experiencing all the ups and downs of family life. Our preparations for celebrating Christmas may not work out as we'd intended, but let's not forget that we're celebrating Jesus' birth and take time to thank God for His love and gift of His Son.

### **Christmas Biscuits**

Ingredients:

100g 3 1/2 0z Softened butter 100g 31/2 oz Caster sugar 1 small Egg beaten 1/2 teaspoon Vanilla essence

Pinch Salt

200g Plain flour sieved

350g 12oz Icing sugar 3 tblsp water

2- 3 drops food colourings

Edilble glitter decorations eg. Silver balls



- Line baking trays with parchment.
- Cream butter and sugar until pale and fluffy.
- Add egg and vanilla, a little at a time.
- Stir in flour.
- Chill for 1 hour.
- Roll out 5-8 mm thick <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>-1/2" thick.
- Cut out using Christmas cutters or a glass.
- If you want to hang as decorations cut out a hole using a straw.
- Bake at 180 degrees C for 8-10 mins until golden brown.
- Leave to harden on the tray for 5 mins, then transfer to a cooling rack.
- Mix the icing sugar, just enough water and a little food colouring or put into 2 bowls and add different colours to each.
- Spread the icing sugar over the biscuits, using a knife, sprinkle with glitter or decorate with sliver balls.
- Thread hanging biscuits with ribbon.

### And Past.....

Just under 100 years ago a Serbian

student Gavrilo Princip fired off two shots that began the insurmountable march to global war that would ultimately lead to the loss of millions of lives. Eleven brave men from the Parish were amongst the fallen. We remember their supreme sacrifice every November at the village memorial , but given that next year is the centenary of the First World War, I felt it would be of value to these Men to have a narrative of their lives and importantly who they were.

With that in mind I have started some initial research and posted this on the Parish Website. Unfortunately, given the passing of time, the information is sketchy, so if there is anyone in the Parish that can help fill in the gaps then I would be grateful. In particular Horace Robert Westlake who was killed in the battle of Loos in 1915. I have been contacted by a lady who has what is believed to be his personal bible that he held when



he fell on the battlefield. The details within the bible have been rubbed out, but what can be gleaned from it is that it was presented by the Wesleyan Chapel in 1906. If we can confirm that this was the South Petherwin Chapel it would indeed be proof that this was Horace's bible. Contact rogerpyke1@gmail.com

# HN; Didn't you say this would be a quiet time in the shop Sarah?. Looks pretty busy to me!

SH; Yes, there is never really a quiet time. We always have a steady stream of customers for the post office. Most of them come from outside of the village as they have lost the Post Offices in their own villages.
