Mixed Berry Cheesecake



Ingredients

300g / 12oz Digestive or ginger biscuits

100-125g / 4-5oz Butter

300ml (or a carton) Double cream or Elmlea (lower fat)

250g /10oz soft cheese

1 Lemon , juice only licing sugar to taste

300-400g / 12oz-1b mixed berries any combination

Method

- 1. Melt the butter and add to the finely crushed biscuits.
- 2. Press down into a base lined 8" loose bottomed tin. Chill.
- 3. Whisk the cream until fairly stiff.
- 4. Mix the soft cheese with the lemon juice.
- Fold into the cream.
- Add icing sugar to taste.
- 7. Chill for at least 2 hours.
- 8. Turn out onto a plate.
- 9. Decorate with berries of your choice.
- 10. Dust with icing sugar.

MAKING HAY WHILE THE SUN SHINES!

June 2014 has been a good hay making month with thousands of bales produced. Local farmer Maggie Warton, whose field is pictured above, said 'I am thrilled with my hay crop this year. It was a nervous time deciding when to cut and would it stay dry for a week. Thankfully this year, the weather was perfect. As the hay will be fed to my horses, it needs to be reasonably dust free and the small bale hay not too heavy. This years crop was just right and the horses will love it'.

Cllr Phil Parsons who is also a farmer, explained why it is important to ensure that hay is properly dried. 'If the hay is not fully dried and contains green grass inside the bale there is a risk that the grass will warm up and get hot enough to ignite the dry grass or other bales in the stack.'



Remembering the Fallen

Seeing The School House may bring to mind Harold Gunner who lived there and another Harold who lived at Petherwin Water.



'Stand Clear—Shocking!'

Sue Vernon describes a recent event in the village hall where a defibrillator was demonstrated and it's value to the community explained.

'Stand Clear-shocking.' That was the call heard in the village hall on the evening of Friday 27th June, when a defibrillator demonstration was given by Launceston Medical Centre minor injuries nurse Pete Wyatt, assisted by nurse practitioner Carol Jackson, and Steve Matthews from the ambulance service. Twenty three parishioners attended, and most took the opportunity to have their blood pressure and blood glucose checked. Then they were allowed a cup of tea or coffee and cake and biscuits – no one wanted a false reading by taking on board too much sugar before the tests! There was a lively and interested atmosphere in the hall as we waited for the demonstration to begin.

Then a life sized torso appeared on the floor and Pete showed us how to carry out CPR correctly— pressing harder than you might expect to the rhythm of 'Staying alive' (remember the Vinnie Jones advert?) whilst waiting for help in the form of a defibrillator (or ambulance) to arrive. As soon as the defibrillator case is opened it 'talks', instructing the first aider to apply two pads to the patient's chest, with diagrams on the pads showing exactly where to place them. The defibrillator—then assesses the condition of the patient and, if it is necessary, will instruct you to press the button to deliver a shock, which will hopefully start the heart beating correctly. It is not possible to cause any harm—the patient is effectively dead without this treatment and the defibrillator will not allow you to give a second shock if it is not needed. There were many questions asked, ably and thoroughly answered by one of the team, and Steve and Pete had many stories to tell of incidents that they had attended—they mostly told us about the happy endings!!

Everyone in the hall agreed that the village should certainly have a public access defibrillator (PAD) – indeed the ambulance service would ideally like to see one every 200metres in populated areas. Some of the comments were 'excellent idea, needs to be pushed forward'; 'very good, a lot I didn't know, so very helpful.'

The purchase of a machine and a waterproof heated box would probably be in the region of £2,500 - £3,000, and the box has to be sited where there is an electrical supply available in order to keep the temperature of the machine constant. This would approximately amount to the cost of a light bulb left on all year. Possible sites will have to be considered. There are several charities from which defibrillators can be purchased, some with aftercare plans, and these will have to be looked into and costs compared.

However, if we can save just one life by obtaining this equipment, the cost will have been worth it. Fund raising will have to be done, and if anyone in the village would like to organise an event for this purpose it would be very worthwhile. We will also enquire about available grants. When all this information has been gathered, another meeting will be held in the hall to inform the village of the progress made.

A Meeting for Everyone.

Each year every Parish in the country is required by law to hold a Parish Meeting. These meetings are to enable the local population to participate in what is going on in their community. To get information, ask questions and give feedback to the local societies, groups, organisations and Parish Councils who function in the area where you live and who in some cases, receive support from the Council Tax you pay. There is a reason for everyone in a Parish to attend and just to be clear, this is not some boring AGM of the Parish Council – that comes later as part of a Parish Council Meeting.

This year approximately 20 members of the public, representatives of organisations and clubs as well as councillors attended a lively session on June 11th to hear about such things as the proposed Community Shop, the World War I Project, benefits from wind turbine discretionary funds, plans by the Parish Magazine and the activities of the BIMBOS exercise group (objective: to keep members fit, flexible and out of the graveyard!) at one end of the scale to the PreSchool at the other. South Petherwin is lucky to have a range of organisations many of which have been around for decades – just look through this magazine for examples.

So next year, whether you are new to the area or lived here for years, come along to the Annual Parish Meeting and learn something new about the place in which you live. I will endeavour to set the date well in advance and give plenty of warning so you will have no excuse!




The South Petherwin website celebrates its 10th anniversary this year. Co founder Phil Parsons talks to Roger Pyke about the website which he designed and continues to manage.

Kisiizi Parents School Uganda 2014

Two Teaching Assistants from South Petherwin School recently visited Kisiizi Parents School in Uganda forging further links between the schools. Here Helen Masters gives a personal account of their experience.

WOW! What an amazing experience! After an incredibly long journey through busy chaotic cities, shanty towns, small rural villages and amazing lush countryside we eventually arrived in Kisiizi. It is situated in a very rural mountainous area in the far south west of Uganda. The school contains 350 children, two hundred of whom are boarders, of which 120 are orphans. It is a private, fee paying school as most schools are in Uganda.

What a welcome we had from the director, staff and children! They were so pleased to see us and excited to find out all about England and our school. The children were shy and giggly to start with, but soon became bolder asking questions and wanting to touch us, to see if we felt the same as them. We were shown around the school, a simple mud building with a metal sheet roof and mud floors set on the side of a steep hill. The classrooms were small and cramped with wooden desks and benches, the only things on the walls were homemade information posters. Each class had up to 55 children. As we went into each class the children stood up and said, "Welcome visitors, how are you? We are pleased to see you at our school." or they sang a welcome song.

All the children seemed so happy, very keen to learn and worked silently. Most of the lessons involved the teacher saying information and the children chanting it back to them, lots of repetition to help them remember facts, because there is only one text book and that is for the teacher. The children work hard 7.30am- 5.30pm every day and 9-1pm on Saturdays. Some of the year six children also go back to school from 7pm -10pm in the evenings. I can't see our children wanting to be at school that long! The children sit end of year exams which they must pass to move on to the next year. This meant that there were children up to 16 years old in the primary school!

Whilst we were at the school we had the opportunity to teach each of the nine classes using art resources that South Petherwin parents, children and staff had donated. We had taken out postcards made by our children with a view from their window drawn or painted on the front and an explanation about the view and details about themselves on the back. (A snapshot of their life.) We took out 350 blank postcards so that we could do the same with the Ugandan children to bring home to show our children. We had to teach them how to use paints as they had never seen or used them before. There was much excitement. The standard of their drawing and writing was incredible. When we taught the baby class-3year olds we made stick puppets with them, luckily I had taken out lolly sticks, feathers, glue and furry bobbles. We thought this would be better for them because they have no toys or resources

so it was great to see them play with their finished puppets (after we had shown them what to do!) The smiles and laughter were so rewarding.

On Sunday we went to the boarding house to join in with the service. It was delivered by the children for the children and apart from the house mother we were the only adults present. We could hear the drumming and singing along the road before we got there. As we got closer it got louder and louder. Entering the dormitory the singing was so loud and filled with joy, I got goose bumps. Two hundred children dancing barefoot in time to traditional African drums, singing Hymns I recognised but which sounded so much better. The preacher was a 12 year old boy, with such charisma, who wants to be a preacher when he is older. I will never forget those 2 1/2 hours.

In the afternoon Darren and I took the boarders to a playing field a short walk away. The school is allowed to use it one afternoon a week because it belongs to another school. We looked like pied pipers walking up the hill with two hundred children following us! We taught them some English games and they showed us some traditional Ugandan games. It was a very happy fun filled afternoon.

Everywhere we went in Uganda people were so friendly, shaking our hands and asking if we were enjoying their country. Thanking us for visiting. It was an amazing trip and I feel so privileged to have to have had the opportunity. I would love to return and help with building a new school. We look forward to Justus and Patrick, two Kisiizi teachers visiting us in the Autumn.

New Skittle Alley for South Petherwin!








