Changes at The Post Office.

Alan Brook, Clerk to the Parish Council, outlines changes that are to occur in the Post Office Service at South Petherwin



t the request of the Post Office, members of the Parish Council met with Mr Colin Pound, Field Change Manager on 10th September. Mr Pound announced that Sarah Hart has resigned as Postmistress with effect from 7th January 2015. It is standard practice when no obvious

location for transfer of Post Office premises is available, for the Field Change Manager to meet initially with the local Council. Government policy is to maintain postal services in rural communities and the Post Office is tasked to make every effort to ensure this happens.

After a discussion of the impact and options available, which included input from Rev Anne Brown, Mr Pound arranged to meet with the Community Shop Committee to consider transfer of facilities to the shop. The Committee and the Post Office would be working with the aim of arranging as seamless a transfer as possible. Mr Pound said that a consultation period with the general public would be undertaken. John Whiting, Chairman of the Parish Council said "While it is sad to hear that our current post mistress has resigned, the Council is pleased that plans are in place to consider the service continuing from a location in the Community Shop."







Fund Update

The South Petherwin Community Grant Fund Trustees formed earlier this year. So far funds amounting to just under £2,500 have been awarded and the committee have another £2,607 from

Trevozah to award and the possibility of a further £1000 from Bottonett.

Projects supported so far include, Tregadillet Songbirds, South Petherwin Allotments, South Petherwin Skittles Club, the WW1 booklet and South Petherwin Cricket Club. Approximately £50 has been spent on administration costs, including postage and printing consumables. We meet about four times a year and all trustee time is given voluntarily.

The trustees are attempting to obtain authority from others who have erected or are proposing to erect wind turbines in the Parish to distribute any money they might give towards local public causes. Developers are entitled to use income from turbines as they see fit . Should they wish to donate to the community, as trustees we are accountable to Parishioners developers and Cornwall Council for distributing the funds responsibly.

We believe money which is said to be for communities may best be distributed by people from those communities. Especially to those who believe they do not benefit in other ways from the turbines.

The trustees are conscious that not everyone is in favour of the turbines. However, for the foreseeable future they are likely to be a part of the local landscape and we would like others to be involved in how any money donated is being spent. An application to become a trustee would be welcome from anyone who works or lives in the Parish. Anyone who would like to discuss becoming a trustee should email the secretary <a href="right-ri

WHERE'S THE LOST MILESTONE?

Following a query from a Councillor I recently contacted the Milestone Society who gave me some information about the stones in our Parish, which have considerable historic importance. They were erected by the Launceston Turnpike Trust shortly after 1760 when an Act of Parliament was obtained for 'amending, widening and keeping in repair several roads leading to the Borough of Launceston'. These roads included the road 'from a certain Place called Pennigillam Pool in the Road aforesaid in the Parish of St Mary Magdalen, through the Parishes of Saint Mary Magdalen and South Petherwin to a certain Place called Trekellearn Bridge in the Parish of South Petherwin'.



Within South Petherwin there were two milestones; one by the old quarry between Daw's House and South Petherwin Churchtown and one opposite the Trecrogo turn. The old quarry one was Grade II listed and disappeared before 2009. A search was made by Milestone Society and Cornwall Highways, without success. The surviving milestone at Trecrogo turn was listed by English Heritage in June 2007.

The turnpike road never went beyond Trekelland Bridge. The milestones south of there, all the way to Liskeard, were erected in the 1890s by the District Highway Boards when they succeeded in having the road made a main road attracting maintenance funding from the County Rate. Our milestone is a different design and much older than these, and as a result is of more historic importance nationally.

The Launceston Turnpike Trust's minute book shows work was done on the road in 1760, 1764 and 1765, but doesn't say exactly when our milestones were erected. We know that they were to be 'set right', i.e. the distance was to be set accurately, one mile apart, in 1843, 'measuring from Centre of Broad Street Market'. Distances were used to calculate carriers' charges for their customer's goods and for the post (until the standard penny post came in).

The milestones were painted by the Launceston Trust as late as 1858 'when weather permits'. In 2008 an agreement was reached between Cornwall County Council and the Milestone Society allowing specified volunteers, after suitable training, to undertake maintenance work on milestones on the Council's behalf. This is why our milestone has been painted recently. In the stagecoach days of the Turnpike Trust, milestones were painted so that travellers could spot them, especially at night when one block of granite can look much like any other. Theft of milestones is very rare so perhaps our lost milestone was struck by a vehicle and uprooted in 2009? Perhaps someone saw it lying by the road and took it 'for safekeeping'. If anyone in the Parish knows where this lost milestone is, please let the Parish Clerk know so that it may be reinstated.

Painting the war memorial

Did you notice the recent repainting of the war memorial lettering? I set myself this task as part of the WW1 commemorations and to honour the young men from the Parish who lost their lives. My first step was to contact the monumental mason expert Mr D Gynn who gave me the advice below. I think it would be useful for anyone considering a repaint of the family gravestone. This is what Mr Gynn told me —

- · Choose a dry sunny day and wash the granite and lettering with a small amount of bleach diluted in water.
- · Clean the lettering with a wire kitchen cleaner. The old flaky paint needs to be rubbed off possibly with some sand paper to create a good base for the paint to hold. Wipe the lettering with cloth.
- Then, take a bottle cork and wrap plain cotton fabric around it. Secure it with an elastic band. The fabric needs to hold the paint but not have any fluffy bits which would stick to the lettering.
- Take a small plate and pour a small amount of black metal paint onto it. Dab the cork in the paint and dab the lettering gently. This stops the paint from running as it would with a paintbrush.
- Allow to dry and dab any missed corner of lettering.

It sounded like a very simple task which would be completed in an hour or so! Nearly three hours later and encouraged by passers-by and a helpful neighbour I had finished. The photo below shows the difference before and after lettering that has been repainted. If you are considering a repaint of the family gravestone give yourself plenty of time..



Volunteering in Bolivia

My name is Rachel Hine, I'm 18 and live in South Petherwin. I recently finished my A levels and have decided to take a break from studying and work as a volunteer in Bolivia, South America. Despite the pressures to apply for university I have always been passionate about going abroad to do some work in developing countries. I am going away with Tearfund who are running an international citizenship service (ICS) programme which is a UK government-funded development programme that brings together 18 to 25-year-olds from all backgrounds to fight poverty overseas. It also aims to create and motivate active citizens to shape their future for the better. I felt this would be a once in a life time trip and something I could put my all my efforts into.

I went for an interview with Tearfund and before I knew it, my placement in Bolivia had been confirmed. I will be flying out in September for 10 weeks. While I am there we will be working in the local community with OESER. This is a project which works with a local business called Mikuni producing and selling cereal bars from the local quinoa grain. All profits go to helping find jobs for local women who have been subject to street poverty and abuse. It also gives grants for local children to attend school reducing their vulnerability on the streets.

The programme is fully funded but I still set myself a fundraising goal of £800 to go directly to the charity and ICS programme. I have been overwhelmed with all the support I have received from family and friends. Also the local Vicar, Anne Brown, who let me hold cake sales in the Church and give a talk at a recent Sunday Service. And the Church Living Well in Plympton who have helped with amazing donations and further fundraisers. As a result of all this I have well and truly exceeded my target and raised £1280!



When I return home in December I will be following up the work I have done in Bolivia in an Action at Home project which I will be eager to get the local community involved in.
