Withy Lantern Making and Carol Singing.

On Saturday the 19th December, withy lantern making took place at the Village Hall. After much time and preparation by Abi Caine we opened the doors. Abi showed myself and Jane how to bend the withy (willow) sticks and fix them in shape with masking tape, so we could then show and help others. It was a surprisingly simple and highly enjoyable skill. We were soon busy with families, young couples, older couples and Reverend Anne Brown making a variety of different lantern shapes, stars, hearts, an owl and Claire Hine made an enormous angel with help from Reverend Anne. The next stage was to smother sheets of white tissue paper with p.v.a glue solution and cover the lantern framework, this was extremely messy and great fun.

Whilst this was going on hot refreshments, including mulled apple juice homemade cakes biscuits and mince pies were available as well as delicious filled jacket potatoes (courtesy of Alison Barham, Reverend Anne, Abi and Sue Vernon and myself). The next step was to attach a torch, night light or string of lights to the lantern and make a pole to hang it off. Then we had to let the lanterns dry over night. We had a constant stream of parishioners all enjoying the event and making new friends.

The next evening, all dressed for the cold wet weather, we collected our lanterns from the Hall and set off to carol sing around the village. The lanterns looked incredible, we couldn't believe we, a group of novices, had done such a good job. Truro festival of lights - beware!

We started at Tiny meadows, moving up the main road, into Trelinnoe Close, Trelinnoe Gardens, the retirement bungalows and St Paternus Close, our lanterns bobbing in the dark. We stopped at intervals singing requests from the carollers and villagers. Cars slowed down and people looked out of their windows. We all thoroughly enjoyed ourselves, especially the children knocking on doors. Unfortunately not as many people came out to listen as we would have liked, probably due to the weather, but this didn't dampen our spirits or our total donations.

We finished just in time to enter the church for the carol service at the beginning of the first hymn. The carol service was beautiful and the remaining children and

adults paraded down the aisle for the last carol adding to the atmosphere. All agreed the two events were a great success and a lovely start to Christmas. Special thanks to Abi for organising everything and having the idea in the first place. We have already discussed repeating the lantern making again next year.

South Petherwin Band of Bellringers—Old and New

For many years it was customary for the old year to be 'rung out' and the new year to be 'rung in' on church bells all over the Country. This year the captain of the tower agreed that we should re-introduce this old tradition in South Petherwin.

Many Towers, particularly in the West Country mark the event by ringing with 'muffled' bells before midnight. This is when each bell has a leather 'glove' attached to one side of the clapper, producing a very soft mellow sound on each alternate stroke. The bells are stilled just before midnight, the muffles quickly removed and then after the church clock has struck midnight and the New Year has arrived, the bells are pealed again, unmuffled now for about ten minutes to welcome the New Year to the Parish.

The process of muffling requires both athletic skill (and agility!) as the bells are mounted high in the church tower, and each one has to be accessed from underneath. Time is of the essence, when all the bells (there are six in our tower) have to be unmuffled in under 10 minutes. Leon Vanstone, Tower Captain, and Malcolm Wright, achieved this feat with under one minute to spare, to loud applause of other less athletic ringers and friends gathered in the ringing chamber.

The evening ended with 2015 being heralded in appropriately with mince pies and Cornish clotted cream and toasted with hot mulled wine .A great way to welcome the New Year, and a tradition that is well worth preserving for the future.

Jobs in January

- •Prune apple and pear trees remove dead, diseased and damaged wood and any crossing branches to open up the centre of the tree and shorten the ends of last years growth spurs to maintain shape.
- •Plant bare rooted plants such as fruit trees and bushes, roses, hedging plants and shrubs if ground is not frozen.
- •Prune climbers such as Wisteria and roses and hard prune overgrown shrubs now whilst they are still dormant.
- •Now is a good time to consider any changes you want to make to your garden and plan what seeds to sow and plants to grow later in the year.

Cornus alba 'Sibirica' - Red -barked Dogwood

A group of shrubs for all year round interest providing autumn leaf colour, fruits and early flowers and coming to their best in winter with spectacular coloured



stems. Cornus are hardy, quick to establish and fast growing, giving wonderful structure to the garden. Hard prune back to the base in March to keep the vibrant coloured new growth. Hopefully, the weather will allow us to get out in the garden over the next few weeks, even in small doses, rewarded by a warm drink and a slab of Christmas cake. 
