WE Day Celebrations! Keep Calm and Carry On





WIND TURBINES

Turbine Consultation meeting

A public consultation meeting was held in the village hall on the evening of Thursday 16th April, regarding a proposal to erect a second turbine on Beacon Hill. The applicant Richard Jasper attended with his agent Peter Wonnacott, who was standing in for his son, and was joined by Mark Quinn who will also have an interest in the turbine, which would be 250m away from the turbine currently being erected on the Beacon. Twenty three parishioners attended the meeting which unfortunately had been arranged at late notice, so it was likely that many people were unaware of it, although it had been advertised on the parish notice boards and the local press.

Therefore another consultation was held on Friday 1st May, chaired by Walter Wonnacott. This time around 40 people attended and the meeting was much calmer and more organised. Mr Wonnacott explained the details of the proposed application and answered many questions put to him. He emphasised that the best way to respond to the application was by letter or e-mail to himself before 15th May; after this date the planning application will be submitted and all responses should be sent to Cornwall County Council planning department. Comments would also be welcomed and taken seriously regarding suggestions about awards to the community in the event of the turbine application being successful.

Gardening Matters

Cornwall is at its best in May as the hedgerows and trees burst into green and with the emergence of our native wild flowers. Everything puts on a growth spurt including the weeds and there are lots of jobs to be done of which here are a few;

Pruning

•Early spring flowering shrubs such as Forsythia and Camelias can be trimmed back into shape.

Sowing and planting

- •Hanging baskets and containers of summer bedding can be planted up ready to go outside by the end of May. Protect them from late frosts and strong winds.
- •Tender vegetable crops such as cucumbers, squash, courgettes, beans and sweetcorn can be sown and transplanted outside once the night temperature improves from the end of May.
- •Dahlia tubers that have been lifted over winter can be planted out or started off in trays of compost with regular watering to help them start to shoot.
- •Softwood cuttings from the new shoots of your favourite shrubs and perennials can be taken in May as the new leafy growth roots easily with the warmer weather.
- •Stake and support climbers and perennials as they grow to prevent damage from wind and rain.
- •Protect young seedlings and new shoots from slugs and snails and other pests.

Cornish Customs

The Anglo Saxons called May Drimilcemonao - 'month of three milkings'. The lush grass of early summer led to an abundance of creamy milk ready to turn into clotted cream or cheese. Prior to the 20th century youngsters of Penzance and St Ives would make 'May Horns' usually fashioned from tin cans and 'May Whistles' made from small branches of the sycamore tree. They would then call on their neighbours with boughs of hawthorn to decorate doorways, and then demand a treat of freshly clotted cream, junket or syllabub – 'suck cream' as it was often

called. Most old Cornish recipe books have a recipe for syllabub which often contained brandy – probably from a barrel that had somehow by-passed the Customs Officer! Why not have a go at making your own junket, to celebrate the month of May and all that spring has to offer.

The argument for

In my opinion wind turbines are a brilliant invention.

And the argument against.....

Recently two meetings were held presenting the Jaspers proposal for a 77m turbine on the Beacon, 250m from the Parsons turbine now under construction. I attended both meetings and got the impression the applicants are confident of success. Why here? We were told this site will generate more power than near the abattoir, plus there is a grid connection. Jaspers will have to provide much the same information for planning as the Parsons turbine so no doubt they hope their application will get approval too.

The main difference however is the issue of cumulative impact. This application will be against the background of 9 large turbines within 5km of the village centre. Also, more recently an application for a turbine at Trevozah Barton was refused on appeal. The comments of the inspector make interesting reading; take a look at PA12/10238 on Cornwall Planning website.

I support renewable energy generation but this latest proposal is a step too far. I believe its approval would be detrimental to the wellbeing of our community, its residents and many local businesses. If Jaspers wish to utilise renewable energy as part of its business plan for the future, perhaps it should investigate how this might be done on site at its abattoir with an off-grid approach not impacting as greatly on its neighbours. This may not generate as much power, it may be more costly, it may be more complex, but how much is the goodwill of our community worth?

South Petherwin Emergency Defibrillator



On Thursday 5th March, Martin Fagan from the Community Heartbeat Trust was at the village hall to help increase aware-

ness about the importance of community defibrillators and how to help if you happen to be with, or come across, someone who has just had a heart attack. His talk was extremely informative, but he also helped to make it fun and memorable. The most important point we all took away from the session was that it is always better to do something rather than nothing.

The national average for survival from a heart attack is 5-6%, but in Staffordshire this is 43%! This is because there are 1700 defibrillators in the county – the highest concentration in the country. Let's hope we never need to use ours, but it is reassuring to know that we do have one and that one day it may help to save someone's life.

VETS scheme

Now that we have installed the defibrillator, we have the option of working with the CHT to install and run a

Village Emergency Telephone System or VETS. A third of all 999 calls are from lone rescuers, so getting help to them quickly is important. VETS is a community run system, and enables up to 10 neighbours to assist pending the arrival of the emergency services. VETS would involve a simple memorable number unique for our village. So, after calling 999 to the ambulance service, you can then call the VETS helpers in the village. Up to 10 lines in the community are rung simultaneously until one of the helpers picks up. The helper then collects and brings the defibrillator to the patient/rescuer. VETS does not replace 999 calls and is not a community responder team. The thought is that the VETS system could also be used in times of other emergencies eg bad weather.

We have some names already for people who would like to get involved if we go ahead with this scheme, but more people are always welcome. If you would like to help in any way or have any queries or suggestions, please contact the following members of the committee:

Village Gems

In the Parish we are very fortunate to have some real 'gems' that perhaps we do not always realise are in our midst – Trekelland Bridge, the Church Bells, the Village Pump, to name but three. There is a fourth that may escape us or be taken for granted, but heard and seen by all – the Church Clock.



Since 1911 – in George V's reign- the clock has chimed the quarters and struck the hours. Now at the age of 104, our clock is beginning to show it's age, and is in need of much TLC. From the outset the clock has had to be wound by hand at least three times a week. This entails a tortuous climb up the church tower, by some faithful volunteers, hard work to wind the mechanisms, and when the hour changes twice a year, a marathon to make sure all is synchronised.

Now that the Community Shop and Post Office is going to be based within the Church, many more people will be seeing and hearing the clock. It is important, therefore that both the Church and the two clock faces are seen at their best. The last time the clock received any care and attention was in 1975 – 40 years ago- hence the pressing need for action now.
